1. Write a short on the Chipko movement.

Ans.i. The Chipko Movement was a forest conservation movement which began in 1974 under the leadership of Chandi Prasad Bhatt and Sunder Lal Bahuguna.

ii.The term 'chipko' means 'to hug'. When the forest of their village was threatened, the women of Reni, Uttarakhand hugged the trees to stop them from being cut down by cutters sent by the government.

iii. The movement continued for four days, after which the cutters left and the trees were saved.

2. How are human activities becoming a threat for wildlife?

Ans. Wildlife is being threatened by uncontrolled human activities.

- i. Forests are being cleared for infrastructure and agriculture. This takes away the natural homes of the animals.
- ii. Pollution by plastic garbage and industrial wastes are harming animals and killing them in large numbers.
- iii. Illegal hunting of animals for their skin, teeth and claws.

3. In what ways can forests be conserved?

Ans. Forests can be conserved by: i. Replanting of forests, wherever possible

- ii. Planned and regulated cutting of trees.
- iii. Controlling Forest fires.
- iv. Proper utilisation of forest resources.
