Ans. Key features of democracy:


• Indian citizens who are 18 years and above have a right to vote and elect their representatives.

Key features of the State Government are:

• A state government looks after the needs of the people like education, medical facilities, finance, security, health, sanitation, food, electricity, water supply, etc.

# 3)Describe the Gram Panchayat.

The elected people are represented in the villages by the Panchayats and in the cities or towns by the Municipal Committees. Features of the Village Panchayats are:

- The Gram Panchayat, takes care of the basic amenities of the villagers.
- The members of the Gram Panchayats are called the Panchs and there should be at least a woman member in the Gram Panchayat.
- The head of the Gram panchayat is known as Sarpanch.

- A municipal committee looks after the needs of the people of the city like education, medical facilities, health, sanitation, food, electricity, water supply, etc.
- Municipal committees maintain land records and collect taxes.
