**Pre Activity- Name a few stories that you have heard or read about animals. Did they have lesson to learn?**

Answer the following:

1. Why did the villagers complain to the king?

Ans- The king and his large hunting party would go to the forest, trampling and damaging the fields on the way. The villagers were very troubled by this. So the villagers complained about it to the king

2. What would Rohanta have told the king?
