

I. 12.1 – Reading the clock and telling the time.


- 1) The long hand of the clock is called the minute hand.
- 2) The short hand is called the hour hand.
- 3) There are 24 hours in a day.
- 4) There are 60 minutes in an hour.




* Quarters of time :-

1. Half past the hour -

When the minute hand goes from 12 to 6, half an hour has passed. Half an hour is 30 minutes. We call this half past the hour.




We write as 12:30.



When the minute hand moves from 12 to 3, a quarter of an hour has passed. Quarter an hour is 15 minutes. We call this quarter past the hour.

Ex - The time is quarter past twelve or twelve fifteen.

We write as 12:15.



When the minute hand moves from 12 to 9, 45 minutes have passed. It means 15 minutes to reach the next hour. We call this quarter to the next hour.


Ex - The time is quarter to five or four forty five.

We write as 4:45.

II. 12.2 Reading a calendar.

1) There are seven days in week.

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday.

2) There are 12 months in a year.

January, February, March, April, May, June, July, August, September, October, November, and December.

- 3) There are 30 or 31 days in a month.
- 4) There are 365 days in a year. Each fourth year is leap year. A leap year has 366 days.
- 5) February has 28 days however February of a leap year has 29 days.
- 8) Note –

1 fortnight = 2 weeks.
