<b>pucca house</b>	<b>Kuchcha house</b>
1.Houses built using bricks, steel, iron, cement, are very strong and are Called <i>pucca</i> houses.	1. Houses made from mud, bamboo, straw, etc., are not very strong and are called <i>kuchcha</i> houses.

**Q. 3. What is the difference between temporary and permanent houses?****Ans:**

Permanent houses	Temporary houses
1. With the passage of time humans wanted to have a shelter with strong boundaries and roof, to protect them from storms, heavy rains and wild animals. So they started making brick houses. These houses were permanent in nature and are called permanent houses.	1. Some people have to move from place to place. They build houses that can be packed and moved easily from one place to another. These are called temporary houses.

- A duplex is a double-storey permanent house.

- A skyscraper is a tall building whose houses are called flats.
